Friday, 04 April 2025 at Zamora Stadium, Mexico

Simangele Hadebe bright start was not enough to help the Joburg South based boxer to dethrone WBC Silver Flyweight defending champion Gabriela Sanchez at the Ignacio Zamora Stadium in Puebla, Mexico on Friday night.

The boxing enthusiasts who were looking forward to ‘Smash’ bringing the belt home would have picked positives from the bout that saw the South African boxer winning the first two rounds.

The fight went the full ten rounds and despite the loss, Hadebe and her camp should be proud of the Limpopo born boxer.

Saturday, 05 April 2025 at Barys Arena, Kazakhstan

Azinga Fuzile who was determined to show his “new version” to the boxing world, taking on unbeaten WBA number two Sultan Zaurbek lost by unanimous 1 point decision in a ten rounder at Barys Arena in Astana, Kazakhstan on Saturday.

The judges scored the fight as follows, awarding the win to the home fighter 98-92, 98-92 and 97-93.

After three successive wins, Fuzile and his camp are back on the drawing board, with the East London born fighter already lined up to be back in the ring in August later this year.
